



The Korean War lasted from the end of Maj. Gen. Kepner’s command until the middle of Maj. Gen. Timberlake’s. Not long after that, the Vietnam War began. In 1955 Dr. Salk’s polio vaccine was declared to be effective.

Andy Warhol began painting his famous pop art.


Super Bowl I was played in 1957 with the Green Bay Packers being crowned champions.



Ray Charles was among popular names during this time.


Play Doh grew to popularity as a children’s toy.

An era of classic television, with shows like *Andy Griffith*, *Dick Van Dyke*, *Beverly Hillbillies*, and *Bonanza*.


Julie Andrews made waves with her stellar performance in the *Mary Poppins* film.



In 1957, the Boston Celtics started their streak of appearing in 10 straight NBA championships, winning all but one.


Roger Maris broke Babe Ruth’s homerun record by hitting 61.

Hank Arron surpassed Babe Ruth with 715th career homerun.




Movies like *Rocky*, *the Godfather*, *Jaws* were released during this time.

Michael Jordan solidified his position as greatest basketball player and arguably the greatest athlete of all time after he won 6 NBA championships.

Duke, led by Coach K, began their journey to becoming one of the most dominant basketball programs in history.

Other notable athletes from this time are Barry Sanders, Shaq, Evander Holyfield, and Tiger Woods.



Popular movies released were *Home Alone*, *Aladdin*, *Jurassic Park*, *Lion King*, *Toy Story*, *Titanic*, *Lord of the Rings*, and *Harry Potter*.

This period was the age of sitcoms with shows like *Seinfeld*, *Cheers*, *Home Improvement*, *FRIENDS*, *Full House*, *Family Matters*, and *The Fresh Prince of Bel -Air*.



Michael Phelps won 8 gold medals in the 2008 Olympics. He would eventually become the most decorated Olympian ever with 28 medals.




Usain Bolt became the fastest man on Earth after running the 100m dash in 9.58 seconds
